What's New

National Building Code of Canada: It is now a requirement that smoke detectors be installed in all sleeping rooms and each corridor in a house.

Council received funding from ACOA and the Provincial Department of Tourism, Culture, Industry and Innovation in the amount of \$288,045.00. This funding enabled us to provide; Visitors Service and Experience Map, Audio Tour App "Walk Brigus", Townscape Interpretive signage, Lighthouse Trail Enhancements and a Permanent Stage. Wanda Smith was hired as Project Manager to oversee the project, along with Clifton Mitchell, Patsy Burke, Randy Butler, Aaron Parsons and Clayton Hunt.

Regrets

Capital Works

Council was approved for 2018-2019 Capital Works funding for Water/Sewer phase 3 Farm Road and Conception Bay Highway Sewer Services in the amount of \$374,000.

In October, a power surge caused damage to the #1 Lift Station located on Conception Bay Highway. Repairs to the Lift Station cost approximately \$66,000. Money approved through the Capital Works Funding was used to complete repairs.

Gas Tax

Council has a balance of \$46,000 left to be distributed over the coming months.

Town Staff

Council also hired several casual workers to do tree pruning.

Waste Management

Residents are reminded that bulk garbage is included with your domestic weekly garbage collection. Council would also like to remind residents that garbage should be kept in proper garbage containers or covered.

Council recently renewed their contact with Ridge G&P contacting starting January 1, 2018 to December 31, 2020. Council has implemented a Recycling Program with bi-weekly pickup. Information regarding the Recycling Program can be found on the Towns website www.brigus.net. Your support in recycling will help reduce waste at landfills along with helping the environment.

The Harbour Grace Waste Recovery Facility is open to residents during the following hours: Tuesday & Thursday 12am to 4pm and Saturday 9am to 5pm. Items such as Construction/Renovation Materials, Metals, Electronics, Furniture etc can be bought to this facility and disposed of free of charge. Council would like to remind residents, if they contact the town office, arrangements can be made to pick up metals, such as: hot water boilers, stoves etc. Metals are not collected during the weekly household garbage collection. A recycling container is located behind the town garage or you can drop them of at French's on Lt Stick Drive in Bay Roberts.

Recreation

A number of different events were held this year with the help of the newly formed Recreation Committee. The Recreation Committee kicked off the formation of the new committee by holding a Family Fun Day on April 21st. There was a great turn out and lots of fun had by all.

Canada Day was a huge success this year with a Canada Day Cake, prizes for best dressed bike, Games, Bouncy Castle, also Hotdogs and Drinks. Entertainment was provided by Front Line. Thanks to our staff and students for putting off such a wonderful event. To conclude the day, the Recreation Committee held a Bon Fire and Sing along at Bishop's Beach.

The Recreation Committee offered a non competitive, mixed age summer softball/t-ball program.

The Recreation Program offered a half day program again this year, with ages 5-8 and 9-12. The program was run by 11 staff that included, Julie Gosse, Katie Quinlan, Jacob Parsons, Hannah Green, David Walsh, Rachel Farrell Zachary Trickett, Nathaniel Norris, Madison Mercer, Ireland Ryan and Bobbie Hepditch Recreation Director. The registration fee this year remained the same at \$80 per child. We went on several field trips and held several special events this summer.

It was another rewarding year for recreation with Staff overseeing the camper parking at the Playground, Toonie parking on our new parking lot, as well as the Nevada Booth during the Blueberry Festival.

Our first annual Halloween Hunt took place on October 28th. The hunt was a great success, with much fun had by both children and adults. Thank you to all the Businesses who took part.

The Christmas Tree Lighting Ceremony had a large attendance. Thank you for coming out and kicking off our Christmas season. Also thank you to the Brigus Historical Society for lighting up Wilcox Gardens.

This year has been another exciting one for our seniors group with support from Community Healthy Living Fund. They participated in several fitness sessions which included Bowling, Curling, and Tai Chi & low impact exercise. They also enjoyed several entertainment sessions and a desert tea. We would like to thank Marilyn Connolly for all her hard work with the seniors program.

Our Walking Track is accessible to all and was built to promote walking and physical activity within our town especially during peak summer months when our narrow streets are usually so congested. We invite you all to get out and check out our new track. 4 Laps equals 1km.

Blueberry Festival

The 31st Annual Brigus Blueberry Festival, once again had a successful year with approximately 12,000 visitors. This year the Festival was ran by the Blueberry Festival Group - a Committee of Council which consists of Council members; Byron Rodway, Randy Spracklin and Paul Matthews, Fire Brigade Representative Jr. Mercer and Public Representative Barry Gosse. The 32nd Annual will be held on August 9th, 10th, & 11th, 2019.

<u>Backwater Valves:</u> Council recommends that all sewer installations should have "Backwater Valves" installed. Also check your Insurance Policy or with your Insurance Company to insure that you are carrying sewer backup on your policy.

<u>Tax Payments:</u> As a reminder, you can pay your taxes by Debit, Visa, MasterCard and postdated Visa and Cheques.

Tax Receipts: Where possible, tax receipts will be sent out by way of email.

<u>Data Base</u>: If a tax payer would like to forward his or her e-mail address, to the town office, it will be stored in the town's data base, this data base will be used to keep residents posted on notices of interest. <u>Fire Hydrants:</u> Even though Council workers will try and keep Fire Hydrants free of snow it is much appreciated if you or a group of neighbors when clearing their driveways would keep in mind to clear the hydrant next to them. These hydrants are there for your safety. For those who are already doing this, THANK YOU.

Special Birthdays and Anniversaries: If you are celebrating a birthday, anniversary or special occasion and wish to receive a certificate of congratulations, please advise the town manager in advance, so one can be arranged for you.

Open Fires: Residents take note that open fires are only permitted between September to April weather permitting and are under the control of the Dept. of Natural Resources (Not Council). Residents must take into consideration, weather conditions i.e. wind and how dry the area is adjacent to the open fire, caution must be taken before starting any fire.

Vandalism: From time to time the town experiences unnecessary acts of vandalism, should you witness any of these acts please contact the town office in confidence, so we can take the necessary steps and possible prosecution to rectify the situation.

Special Events: In June 2018 The Ride for Dad visited Brigus with approximately 500 motor cycles. This group of riders were on a fund-raising campaign in aid of Prostate Cancer. Also in June The Tom Furey Classic Car Club visited Brigus. Proceeds from this activity were forwarded to the Heart & Stroke Foundation. July 29th, the First Responders Memorial Motorcycle Ride visited Brigus. All proceeds of this ride go to the TEMA Conter Memorial Trust based out of Ontario. A non-profit organization dedicated to helping first responders and military personnel who are dealing with mental illness or crisis. In September 2018 Targa once again visited Brigus.
