National Building Code of Canada: It is now a requirement that smoke detectors be installed in all sleeping rooms and each corridor in a house.

When visiting the town hall you will notice that we have recently completed renovations. The exterior of the building has been painted to match our newly constructed stage as well as some updating inside which includes an updated layout, wheel chair accessible counter, paint and flooring.

## **Municipal Election**

There was a By-election held on September 24, 2019 after Councilor Raelene Wall resigned from her seat. Shears Mercer Jr and Greg Hiscock ran for the position and Shears Mercer Jr. was elected.

## **Education & Training**

Council and Staff attended the following Education & Training throughout the year: MNL Avalon Regional Meeting - Ralph Trickett, 2019 Clean & Safe Drinking Water Conference - Kevin Spracklin. Recreation NL Conference – Raelene Wall and Bobbie Hepditch PMA Convention – Wayne Rose PMA Fall Forum- Wayne Rose & Katie O'Flaherty MNL Convention – Byron Rodway, Paul Matthews, Ralph Trickett and John Brown. In order to receive "Gas Tax Funding" Council is required to attend a minimum of 2 training sessions per year.

## **Capital Works / Projects**

Council was approved for 2019-2020 Capital Works funding for in the amount of \$458,709.00 to upgrade the intake at Long Pond. This is on a cost sharing basis 90/10. This should start the spring of 2020.

Capital Works funding is applied for to extending sewer line on CB Highway.

Council hired Nova Consultants Inc.to engineer a "Pedestrian Bridge" located next to the Town Stage at a cost of \$5,865.00 (Taxes Inc.). A call for tender was issued but we had no response. Council will re-tender this spring.

Renovations took place at the Town Hall. An accessible counter was added along with new flooring at a cost of \$10,512.42. The Town Hall was also painted through the Impacted Fish Plant Worker Program.

## **Gas Tax**

A new Washrooms/Canteen/Storage building was built at our park. This cost \$93,570.15. Council has a balance of \$200,521.28 left to be distributed over the coming months.

## Waste Management

Residents are reminded that bulk garbage is included with your domestic weekly garbage collection. Council would also like to remind residents that garbage should be kept in proper garbage containers or covered.

Recycling Program will continue on a bi-weekly basis. Information regarding the Recycling Program can be found on the Towns website <u>www.brigus.net.</u> Your support in recycling will help reduce waste at landfills along with helping the environment.

The Harbour Grace Waste Recovery Facility is open to residents during the following hours: Tuesday & Thursday 12am to 4pm and Saturday 9am to 5pm. Items such as Construction/Renovation Materials, Metals, Electronics, and Furniture etc. can be bought to this facility and disposed of free of charge. You may also contact Otto Clowe for a

Council would like to remind residents that by contacting the town office arrangements can be made to pick up metals, such as: hot water boilers, stoves etc. Metals are not collected during the weekly household garbage collection. A recycling container is located behind the town garage or you can drop them off at French's located on Lt. Stick Drive in Bay Roberts.

## Recreation

It was a great year for Recreation in our community and we are very happy with our new storage/washroom/canteen facility located at our multipurpose park.

The Recreation Committee offered a noncompetitive, mixed age summer softball/t-ball program and ended their year with a BBQ and fireworks. There was lots of fun had by all. A special thank you to Mike Power for the firework display.

Due to a decrease in participants, The Recreation Program offered a full day program this year for kids ages 5-12. The program was ran by Jacob Parsons, Zachary Trickett, Spencer Norris, Madison Mercer, Chloe Clarke, Mackenzie Akerman, Tori Efford, Benjamin Percy and overseen by Bobbie Hepditch - Recreation Director. The committee would like to thank the Fire Department for their support and guidance in helping make the festival a great success. Together we will do great things.

The committee has since purchased all materials used during the festival from the former Blueberry Festival Committee for a sum of \$2000. The Town of Brigus looks forward to supporting and promoting the 33<sup>rd</sup> Annual Blueberry Festival which will be held on August 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, & 9<sup>th</sup>, 2019.

**Backwater Valves:** Council recommends that all sewer installations should have "Backwater Valves" installed. Also check your Insurance Policy or with your Insurance Company to insure that you are carrying sewer backup on your policy.

**Tax Payments:** As a reminder, you can pay your taxes by Debit, Visa, MasterCard and postdated Visa and Cheques. **Tax Receipts:** Where possible, tax receipts & statements will be sent out by way of email.

**Fire Hydrants:** Even though Council workers will try and keep Fire Hydrants free of snow it is much appreciated if you or a group of neighbors when clearing their driveways would keep in mind to clear the hydrant next to them. These hydrants are there for your safety. For those who are already doing this, THANK YOU.

**Special Birthdays and Anniversaries:** If you are celebrating a birthday, anniversary or special occasion and wish to receive a certificate of congratulations, please advise the town manager in advance, so one can be arranged for you. **Open Fires:** Residents take note that open fires are only permitted between September to April weather permitting and are under the control of the Dept. of Natural Resources (Not Council). Residents must take into consideration, weather conditions i.e. wind and how dry the area is adjacent to the open fire, caution must be taken before starting any fire.

**Vandalism:** From time to time the town experiences unnecessary acts of vandalism, should you witness any of these acts please contact the town office in confidence, so we can take the necessary steps and possible prosecution to rectify the situation. Council would also like to thank all those who are in any way helping to keep our town tidy and keeping our hydrants free of snow.

**Special Events:** In June 2019 The Ride for Dad visited Brigus with approximately 300 motor cycles. This group of riders were on a fund-raising campaign in aid of Prostate Cancer. The Tom Furey Classic Car Club visited Brigus on August 25<sup>th</sup>.
